

Master's Thesis Guidelines @QManD for students coming from foreign institutions: Essential Information

If you are studying in a foreign university and are considering undertaking your master's thesis project at Chalmers University, here are some fundamental guidelines to assist you in the process.

It is very helpful to attain a student status, enabling you to become a member of the student association and avail various discounts, ranging from public transportation to grocery shopping. To obtain student status at Chalmers, you can choose either of the following options:

- 1) Conduct your master's thesis within the **Erasmus** project.

OR

- 2) Apply for a master's thesis project directly at Chalmers using the designated form, available [here](#)*.

Eligibility requirements, fully detailed in the form, include proficiency in the English language, which can be demonstrated in [various ways](#).

Typically, a thesis at Chalmers can span either **6 months** (equivalent to half a school year or one semester) or **9 months** (a full school year or two semesters). The specific duration must be discussed with your supervisor.

Upon successful application, you will be officially admitted to Chalmers University as a student and can join the student association by paying a nominal fee (approximately 200 SEK). For more information, visit the Chalmers Student Association website: <https://chalmersstudentkar.se>

It is worth mentioning that the status of Chalmers student so acquired following these procedures is not enough to enable you to obtain the *personnummer*, the Swedish social number necessary for tasks such as opening a bank account.

* Students from Politecnico di Milano are required to provide:

1. Bachelor's diploma
2. Master's degree transcript of records

Those documents can be requested on the university's online services website. You may opt for either the paper version (to be scanned) or the digitally signed one. The estimated cost is approximately €32 per document.
